

# Bloodline of Holy Grail: Messianic Descent of Kings of Bohemia

## INTRODUCTORY NOTE

With the publication of the highly popular Dan Brown's novel *The Da Vinci Code*,<sup>1</sup> resurfaced the ancient belief that Jesus was married to St. Mary Magdalene. If one examines the existing evidence, the supposition seems highly probable. In any case, it is a fact that Mary Magdalene gave birth to several children who were most likely fathered by Jesus.

In his authoritative text, *Bloodline of the Holy Grail*,<sup>2</sup> the eminent British genealogist, Sir. Laurence Gardner, constructed a detailed genealogy, linking Mary Magdalene's descendants with the Franks' Royalty and with the Royal House of Stewart of Scotland.

Based on the monumental work of Sir Laurence Gardner, I have now extended the Bloodline of Mary Magdalene (and Jesus) to the rulers of Kingdom of Bohemia. Although I have included only the linkages to Duke Bretislav I (1005-1055) and to King Vladislav II (1110-1174), there are many other possible linkages, connecting Bohemian rulers with the Messianic Bloodline. One can conclude that all Premyslide rulers, starting with the descendants of Duke Bretislav I and Judith of Schweinfurt, would thus descend from Mary Magdalena, as would the members of the Bohemian Jagiellonian dynasty, Luxembourg dynasty and the Habsburg dynasty.
