The SVU 6-MINUTE CHALLENGE is a series conceived in 2015 by Suzanna Halsey for SVU New York. Czech and Slovak artists, professionals, scholars, students and scientists are challenged to present their talent, the subject of their work, project, research or studies in a short presentation limited to six minutes.

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Lenka Lichtenberg is a Czech-Canadian musician, composer, and producer who relocated to Toronto after spending her early years as a notable child star in her native Prague. Her latest project is *Thieves of Dreams*, based on notebooks written by her grandmother while she was imprisoned in the Theresienstadt concentration camp during World War II. In 2023, the album won Canada's top music prize, the JUNO Award for Global Music Album of the Year. Her 2024 album *Feel With Blood: Echoes of*


Theresienstadt further explores and expands this source material in English. Lenka tours internationally. Since 2023, she has performed in Copenhagen, Montreal, Prague, Madrid, Sao Paolo, Buenos Aires, Edinburgh Fringe, Theresienstadt, Taipei, Sydney, Tokyo, and Washington, D.C. Lenka brought her solo show *The Secret Poetess of Terezin* to Calgary's National Music Centre, Ottawa's National Arts Centre, and now to New York on April 10 as part of the United Solo Festival. 

Always passionate about dance, Irena became involved with the international ballroom dance world, and in 2008, she won the US Adult Amateur Latin Ballroom Championships. It was at this time she started creating costumes for the dance and burlesque communities. Canova Studio is now recognized worldwide. She is

known for her elaborate designs with rhinestones inspired by her Czech and Turkish heritage. Her work has been seen in Bloomingdale's, the Fosse/Verdon TV miniseries, the Hustler movie, and RuPaul's Drag Race. She works with theaters, celebrities, stylists, and dancers. Some of her famous clients include Usher, Meghan Trainor, Cardi B, Floyd Mayweather, and lately Charlotte Flair, the US wrestling champion; also Company XIV theater and La Jolla Playhouse.


